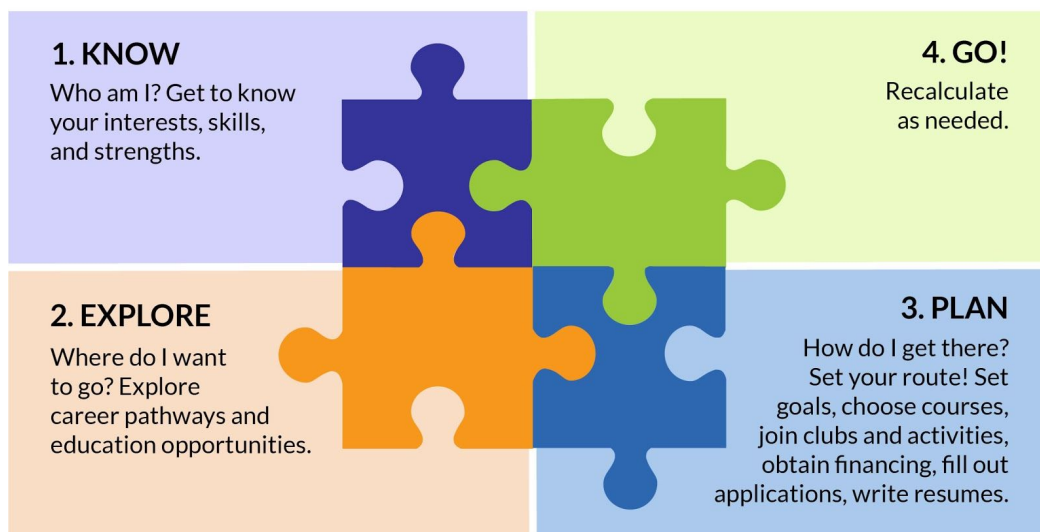

4 Stages to Successful Academic and Career Planning (ACP)



Self-Awareness (KNOW)

- Periodic self-assessment of interests and strengths
- Reflection and goal-setting
- Financial knowledge & understanding of resources
- Academic courses & skill preparation
- Behavioral & employment

Career Exploration (EXPLORE)

- Middle School career exploration activities and opportunities
- High school career exploration activities and opportunities
- World of work and labor market needs
- Understanding and comparing different postsecondary education & training

Career Planning (PLAN)

- Planning skills
- The Middle School plan
- The High School plan

Career Management (GO)

- Executing the plan
- Updating the plan with new information & artifacts
