- **our own elementary and middle school** to work students (and their families) who are English language learners.
- Also within our own high school community, there are connections to a family that owns a
  non-profit organization that works to save albino children in Africa. A GEAC candidate would
  have access to the leaders of that organization to collaborate on a project to benefit
  ZeruZeru.

A proposal of the global community service project, along with timeline for the minimum 20 hours, will be submitted to Mrs. Corbin and Mr. Faris for approval toward the GEAC prior to the implementation of said project.

All hours must be completed by April of the GEAC candidate's graduation year.
